What is this project about?

Hosted by the Telethon Kids Institute and funded by the Minderoo Foundation, CoLab actively responds to the need to accelerate the implementation of practical and relevant early childhood research outcomes to those who need it most throughout Australia.

CoLab aims to bring together the community, practitioners, teachers, educators, government and researchers to improve evidence-based service delivery that meets the needs of vulnerable children, families and communities.

One of the projects to be delivered by CoLab is the development of a smartphone app that will provide evidence-based information for childhood learning and development. This smartphone app will target parents or carers of children aged between 0 – 8 years and focus on providing quick support and accessible "in the moment" information that aims to enhance caregiver/child relationships. Parents and caregivers will better understand their child's development and provide the right kind of assistance and environment to assist in their child's mental and physical growth.

What does participation involve?

As an expecting (pregnant) person, or carer or parent of a child aged between 0 - 8 years old (inclusive) and living in Western Australia, you are invited to participate in this project by completing a 15-minute online survey about your thoughts and experiences of accessing parenting information and potential features you would like to see in the smartphone app. The results from the survey will assist the project team to develop the smartphone app that will deliver key information and features that is relevant, and meets the needs of the community. Participants completing the survey have the option of entering a draw to win one of five \$20 Coles/Myer vouchers.

Voluntary Participation and Withdrawal from the Study

Participation in this study is entirely voluntary. Should you no longer wish to be involved, you are free to

Your privacy

All project-related information including participant information will be treated in a confidential manner and be stored securely at the Telethon Kids Institute's password-protected electronic database or locked in the project manager's office and will only be accessed by the research team.

We are required to store the data for a minimum of 7 years after publication or project completion, or until the participant has reached 25 years of age (whichever is later), after that time it will be destroyed.

The information and data gathered from this study may be published, however the identity of participants will not be disclosed at any time. Participant privacy and the confidentiality of information provided by participants, is assured at all other times. The data will be used only for this project, and will not be used in any extended or future research.

What are the possible benefits of this research project?

The smartphone app aims to provide parents with information about their children's learning and development as well as supporting services that they may wish to contact. By having a better understanding of their child's development, CoLab aims to enhance their parent/child relationship and assist in their child's physical and mental growth.

Are there any risks in participating in this research project?

There are no foreseeable risks associated with taking part in this project.
